It starts with PRAYER Prayer guide

The job of every Christian is to pray. Plain and simple. Yet we the "followers", trying to **BE** faithful, want to DO more than simply pray. We want to **DO** something important for God; we want to BE someone important to Him ... we want to show OUR strength and exert **OUR** influence. But that 's not what Jesus said to do. To Jesus prayer is a duty as well as a privilege; a right as well as a responsibility. Many of us pray as a last resort ... when there is nothing else we can do. But Jesus expects us to pray **BEFORE WE DO** anything at all. He wants, and expects us to speak to Him as we would speak to a person right next to you / me (because He is!). Prayer is a conversation with God. Like the conversation we have with the person next to us, He wants us to look and listen for His response (because He does!).

He wants us to pray. Always and about everything. During times of joy, boredom and as well as sorrow. He wants us to **TALK TO** Him, not, **TALK ABOUT** Him. (Adapted from Prayer: A Holy Occupation, by Oswald Chambers)

But what do I say when I talk to Him? How can I be sure I am praying acceptably? We can do God no greater honor than to ask Him for the hard things and then trust that He will hear us. God's promise to hear our prayers does not mean, of course, that He will give us anything we ask. But He will reply. His answers, at a minimum, are "Yes, No, or Not now." But in some cases, He replies with amazingly specific detail.
